3 FOR the purpose of ~~requiring that the Medical Assistance Program include a certain~~

27 WHEREAS, Many individuals with disabilities would like to work but cannot
 28 afford to enter the workforce because that would mean losing the necessary medical
 29 services they receive through Medicaid; and

30 WHEREAS, The federal Ticket to Work and Work Incentives Improvement Act
 31 allows states to establish new Medicaid eligibility categories for working people with
 32 disabilities whose income or resources would otherwise make them ineligible for
 33 Medicaid; now, therefore,

34 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 35 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (i) "Program" means the Maryland Medical Assistance Program.

3 (A) THE PROGRAM SHALL INCLUDE AN EMPLOYED PERSONS WITH
4 DISABILITIES PROGRAM.

5 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE EMPLOYED PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM
6 IS TO PROVIDE THE OPPORTUNITY FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES TO BE
7 EMPLOYED AND TO QUALIFY FOR PROGRAM BENEFITS.

8 (C) AN INDIVIDUAL IS ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE EMPLOYED PERSONS
9 WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM IF THE INDIVIDUAL:

10 (1) IS BETWEEN THE AGES OF 16 AND 64 YEARS OLD, INCLUSIVE;

11 (2) (I) IS DISABLED UNDER TITLE II OR TITLE XVI OF THE SOCIAL
12 SECURITY ACT; OR

13 (II) EXCEPT FOR PROVISIONS RELATING TO SUBSTANTIAL GAINFUL
14 ACTIVITY, WOULD QUALIFY FOR SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY INCOME OR SOCIAL
15 SECURITY DISABILITY INSURANCE;

16 (3) RECEIVES FINANCIAL COMPENSATION FOR EMPLOYMENT, WITH
17 APPLICABLE PAYROLL WITHHOLDINGS FOR PAYMENT OF FEDERAL, STATE, AND
18 LOCAL TAXES;

19 (4) MEETS THE ASSET LIMITATIONS UNDER SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS
20 SECTION;

21 (5) MEETS THE FINANCIAL LIMITATIONS REQUIRED UNDER
22 SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION; AND

23 (6) IF APPLICABLE, PAYS THE PREMIUM REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION
24 (G) OF THIS SECTION.

25 (D) IN DETERMINING AN INDIVIDUAL'S INCOME UNDER SUBSECTION (F) OF
26 THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING:

27 (1) INCOME DISREGARDED FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING
28 ELIGIBILITY FOR THE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE, AGED, BLIND, AND DISABLED
29 CATEGORY UNDER COMAR 10.09.24; OR

30 (2) INCOME USED TO PAY FOR IMPAIRMENT RELATED WORK EXPENSES.

31 (E) (1) AN INDIVIDUAL IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR THE EMPLOYED PERSONS
32 WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM IF THE INDIVIDUAL'S ASSETS EXCEED \$10,000.

33 (2) IN DETERMINING AN INDIVIDUAL'S ASSETS UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)
34 OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING:

7 ~~SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1,~~
8 ~~2004, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall submit to the Centers for~~
9 ~~Medicare and Medicaid Services of the United States Department of Health and~~
10 ~~Human Services an application to amend the State's existing Medical Assistance~~
11 ~~Program so as to implement the Employed Persons with Disabilities Program.~~

12 ~~SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of~~
13 ~~Health and Mental Hygiene, within 5 days after receipt of approval or denial by the~~
14 ~~Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services of the application for the Employed~~
15 ~~Persons with Disabilities Program, shall forward a copy of the approval or denial to~~
16 ~~the Department of Legislative Services, 90 State Circle, Annapolis, Maryland 21401.~~

17 ~~SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:~~

18 (1) ~~If the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services approves the~~
19 ~~application for implementation of the Employed Persons with Disabilities Program:~~

20 (i) ~~Section 1 of this Act shall take effect 3 months after the date on~~
21 ~~which the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services issues its approval; and~~

22 (ii) ~~Within 7 months of the date on which the Centers for Medicare~~
23 ~~and Medicaid Services issues its approval, the Department of Health and Mental~~
24 ~~Hygiene, in consultation with the Maryland Coalition for Work Incentive Program,~~
25 ~~shall adopt regulations to implement the Employed Persons with Disabilities~~

27 (2) ~~If the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services denies the~~
28 ~~application for implementation of the Employed Persons with Disabilities Program,~~

31 (A) TO THE EXTENT THAT FUNDING IS AVAILABLE IN THE STATE BUDGET,
32 THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE SHALL IMPLEMENT THE
33 EMPLOYED PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM BY JULY 1, 2005.

34 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE EMPLOYED PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM
35 IS TO ENCOURAGE INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES TO SEEK OR MAINTAIN
36 EMPLOYMENT.

37 (C) (1) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT DEVELOP
38 SPECIFIC ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE EMPLOYED PERSONS
39 WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM.

1 (2) PRIOR TO ADOPTING THE REGULATIONS REQUIRED UNDER
2 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:

3 (I) CONSULT WITH THE COALITION FOR WORK INCENTIVES
4 IMPROVEMENT; AND

5 (II) GIVE PREFERENCE TO THE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR
6 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA DEVELOPED BY THE COALITION.

7 (D) AT LEAST EVERY 3 YEARS AFTER THE ADOPTION OF THE REGULATIONS
8 REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
9 REVIEW THE REGULATIONS IN CONSULTATION WITH THE COALITION FOR WORK
10 INCENTIVES IMPROVEMENT.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

12 (a) On or before January 1, 2004, the Department of Health and Mental
13 Hygiene shall issue a preliminary report on the implementation of the Employed
14 Persons with Disabilities Program and the use of the federal grant funds for
15 implementation activities to the Governor, and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the
16 State Government Article, the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, the Senate
17 Finance Committee, the House Appropriations Committee, and the House Health and
18 Government Operations Committee; and

19 (b) On or before January 1, 2005, the Department of Health and Mental
20 Hygiene shall issue a final report defining the specific eligibility criteria and the
21 status of implementation of the Employed Persons with Disabilities Program to the
22 Governor, and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the
23 Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, the Senate Finance Committee, the House
24 Appropriations Committee, and the House Health and Government Operations
25 Committee.

26 SECTION 5. ~~3.~~ AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, ~~except as provided in~~
27 ~~Section 4 of this Act,~~ this Act shall take effect July 1, 2003.
